The South African Book Development Council will host the South African Book Fair at Museum Africa in Newtown, Johannesburg from 8 to 10 September 2017.

The council emphasised the importance of South Africans celebrating their heritage and diversity and highlighted the South African narrative in their support of the South African Book Fair. It is an opportunity to come together and embrace South Africa's unique diversity. The theme for this year's fair is #OurStories. This idea stems from the book fair's mission to acknowledge the role that all private and corporate citizens play in the greater South African and African story.

Chief Executive Officer of the council, Elitha van der Sandt, said books are one of the oldest means of communication and distribution. Besides the legitimate industrial and economic activities involved in producing books, they also make a spiritual, educational and cultural

They will also hear them speak on topics they are passionate about that tell the African story. The book fair will be the climax of National Book Week which runs from 4 to 10 September 2017.
